My dear Jesus:

I just got back to the City this morning and found among other things your check which Loftus said had been returned by somebody with the statement that you had not acted as watchman but had worked twelve hours a day during the two week period and wanted to know what I knew about it. Of course I know nothing about it as I was away all that time, except that somebody on receipt of your letter took the matter up with Loftus and later fired you to go on as watchman till work started again. As I know you are in need of money I am sending the same check out to you again and you can go ahead and use it and we will talk it over when I am able to get out and make whatever seems to be a fair adjustment. Hope this will be satisfactory with you. I had expected to come out today but business and an infected right eye which seems to threaten trouble make it impossible. Will be out some time next week however.

Hope everything is going fine and the family all well.
